FOR OVER 35 YEARS, NYPD Detectives have been on the other end of the line at 800-577-TIPS, ready to take anonymous calls from members of the public who have information that could help solve a crime. The New York City Police Foundation provides the funds for rewards paid out for tips to both the **Crime Stoppers** Program and **Operation Gun Stop**, ensuring that tipsters remain anonymous. These programs exemplify the NYPD's commitment to a shared responsibility for public safety, combining the efforts of Police Detectives with those of both the public and the Foundation and its donors to help keep New York safe.

THWARTING TERRORISM

THE NYPD is on the front line when it comes to protecting New York City from the threat of terrorism. Fortunately for everyone who lives, visits or works in New York, the NYPD is the most professional and capable Police Department in the United States. But even with their expansive capabilities, the dedicated men and women of the Department still need our help to ensure that they have the tools necessary to do their job. That's why the New York City Police Foundation devotes significant resources every year to fund vital counterterrorism programs which go beyond the city's budget. Since 2002, the Foundation has funded the stationing of NYPD Intelligence Officers across the globe to gather firsthand intelligence on worldwide counterterror operations. NYPD INTELLIGENCE OFFICERS ARE STATIONED IN THESE CITIES are building contacts with local law enforcement agencies and providing in-depth analysis to their counterparts back home. The Foundation also funds the purchase of highly-trained explosive detection canines which are capable of detecting the airborne particles left behind in the wake of a person who is carrying explosives, enabling them to find that person or any devices they leave behind in large moving crowds.

STRENGTHENING COMMUNITIES ENGAGING YOUTH

NEIGHBORHOOD POLICING is the priority for the NYPD and the New York City Police Foundation, and both the Department and the Foundation are acutely aware of the vital role to be played by young New Yorkers in this effort. The Foundation has supported Neighborhood Policing since the beginning and as the NYPD continues to focus on working with New York youth, the Foundation will be leading the way by supporting the Options program which has already connected Police Officers with 5,000+ young people. This comprehensive program is designed to provide participants with decision-making skills, a voice in their community, and career development opportunities.

During the COVID-19 Pandemic, the Options team has adapted the program to address changing

a three step approach to connect young people and Police Officers, as they work together to build deeper relationships and a safer future for all New Yorkers. dynamics and social distancing restrictions, for both today and the future. During the summer of 2020, the NYPD and the Police Foundation developed Options **Learn2Earn**, which pays young people a stipend to participate in remote educational workshops in subjects ranging from financial management to computer programming, and which connects them with employment opportunities.

PILOTING TECHNOLOGIES PROVIDING RESOURCES



IN 2019, the NYPD and New York City Police Foundation announced an initiative rolling out 550 new light-weight bullet-resistant vests for NYPD Detectives. The bulletresistant vests previously in use by Detectives were heavier and thicker, making it difficult for undercover officers and non-uniform personnel to wear them under or over their suits or other attire. The new vests are easier to wear over clothing, while still offering lifesaving protection. The need for the light-weight vests was underscored after the tragic incident that resulted in the line of duty death of Detective Brian Simonsen in February 2019.

Thanks to the support of our generous donors, the Foundation has provided the NYPD with protective equipment such as masks, gloves and hand sanitizer, and coordinated the delivery of meals to precincts. The Foundation's support also extended beyond supplies to providing hotel rooms for officers who needed to isolate themselves from family members at greater risk to complications from the Coronavirus.
